Behavioral Crisis Center (BCC)

- Rapid Access Unit (RAU)
 - 24/7 voluntary treatment unit
 - Comprehensive treatment team
 - Functions as standalone stabilization as well as triage for the other units within the BCC and Connection Center for other Burrell and community services
- Adult Crisis Stabilization Unit (ACSU)
 - 24/7 voluntary treatment unit
 - Intermediary level of care between acute stabilization and inpatient
- Social Setting Detox
 - 24/7 voluntary treatment unit

BCC: Psychiatric and Medical Services

- Staffing
 - 24/7 nursing coverage with two nurses on staff (at least one an RN) on each shift
 - Daily devoted coverage by psychiatrists, psychiatric APRNs, and/or primary care physicians; all MAT waived
 - Leveraging tele-health for overflow clients or times outside devoted coverage
 - 24/7 behavioral tech coverage to assist the medical team
 - 24/7 psychiatry on-call coverage

BCC: Psychiatric and Medical Services

- Initial Health Assessment
 - Conducted by nurse to determine medical stability and ensure inclusion/exclusion criteria
 - Includes screening of current medication list and history, CIWA, COWS, urine drug screen, and breathalyzer combined with Glasgow coma screening

BCC: Psychiatric and Medical Services

- Medication Handling and Administration
 - Any home medications brought into the facility are identified and inventoried by an RN, communicated to the provider for administration approval, and passed in a L1MA fashion
 - Stock medications kept on site and inventory managed by Burrell pharmacy (Omniceil unit on the way!)
 - Currently developing single dose ordering in the EHR similar to hospital arrangements
 - Medications outside the BCC formulary are sent to Burrell pharmacy (or pharmacy of client choice) for filling and delivery during stay
 - Discharge scripts are sent to pharmacy of choice
 - Change of medication form is uploaded to existing clients' charts and sent directly to the outpatient provider/nurse
